1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by Chairman Everett.

3. Review/Approve Minutes of April 7, 2021

Selectman Curtis made a MOTION to approve the minutes of April 7, 2021. Seconded by Vice Chairman Lyman. MOTION PASSED.

6. Discussion/Action on April 21, 2021 General Warrant #8

Selectman Frederick made a MOTION to approve and sign the April 21,2021 Sewer Commitment in the amount of \$21,063.85. Seconded by Vice Chairman Lyman. MOTION PASSED.

10. Presentation by Christian Savage (Somerset Economic Development Corp.) and Brian Lippold (Casco Bay Advisors) Regarding the Somerset County Broadband Feasibility Study

Christian Savage spoke regarding a study Somerset Economic Development Corp. (SEDC) is working on to bring broadband to rural areas. SEDC has applied and been awarded a planning grant for broadband expansion. There was a gap in funding; the County allocated \$60,000, but the project would still require a proportionate contribution from the five largest communities in Somerset County. Norridgewock's share is \$3,200.

Brian Lippold representing Casco Bay Advisors spoke regarding the work needed to identify the areas that do not have access at this time as well has a cost study to provide access to these areas.

Selectman Frederick made a MOTION to authorize the expenditure of \$3,200 from TIF funds for Norridgewock's proportionate share of the Somerset County Broadband Feasibility Study. Seconded by Vice Chairman Lyman. MOTION PASSED.

11. Discussion/Action on 2021 Proposed Roads for ATV Trails

Vice Chairman Lyman made a MOTION to approve the 2021 Proposed Roads for ATV Trails, as amended. Seconded by Selectman Curtis. MOTION PASSED.

12. Discussion/Action on Fire Department Facia Project

There was a discussion regarding the status of the facia used in the construction of the fire department and the response issued by the contractor. The Town Manager will reach out to Blaine Casey and ask him to meet with the Town Manager and Fire Chief to discuss options for remedying the faulty material.

13. Discussion/Action on Excess Property Disposal (Letter Board Sign)

Selectmen Frederick made a MOTION to donate the letter board sign to Somerset Grange. Seconded by Selectman Curtis. MOTION PASSED, 3-0-1 (Everett, Curtis, Frederick in favor; Lyman abstained).

The Board continued its discussion regarding the role of the board, each member's goals and visions for the community. There was discussion about the role of the Town in economic development.

15. Discussion/Action on Erosion Road Projects (Sandy River and Father Rasle Roads)

Vice Chairman Lyman made a MOTION to retain Dirigo Engineering for the engineering design and permitting of the Sandy River Road erosion project and Haley Ward for an initial consult on the Father Rasle Road erosion project. Seconded by Selectman Curtis. MOTION PASSED.

Vice Chairman Lyman made a MOTION to award Misner Law Care the contract for downtown striping, in the amount of \$2,500.00. Seconded by Selectman Curtis. MOTION PASSED.

Vice Chairman Lyman made a MOTION award Fine Line Pavement Striping the contract for striping Ward Hill Road, in the amount of \$6,930.00 Seconded by Selectman Curtis. MOTION PASSED.
