Mr. LaBelle provided an update on the Airport Advisory Committee Meeting that was held on Monday. There was no action taken. The Committee believes that the airport is in need of snow removal equipment that has worn out. The Committee has prioritized a new snowblower as its top need. If that can't be funded by FAA, then they would look for a whole snow removal package (carrier vehicle, attachments). The next priority project is the reconstruction of taxilanes in the 400-800 hangar rows.

Mr. LaBelle asked for ideas regarding potential photograph locations, to be captured under the existing photography contract.

Mr. Everett commented on the snowbanks at Mill Stream Elementary and the overall poor maintenance of the parking lot this winter. Mr. LaBelle is already working with the school to address this, as the lot is maintained by a contractor. Mr. Everett also thanks the Public Works Department for helping to fix the banks on Madison Road and Ward Hill Road to support safe snowmobile passage.
