

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT APRIL 19, 2023

ADMINISTRATION

- Proposals for IT Services are due May 10. So far, we have had two site visits and received two proposals, with more vendors expressing interest.
- The Food Drive and Personal Care Item Collection continues through the end of this month. Collection points are at the Town Office and Mill Stream Elementary School.
- We are still accepting requests for the spring work day being put on by students at the high school. On May 12, over 140 students will be out in the SAD 54 communities completing projects. We have several residents who have signed up and we will also have projects on public property to do.
- We have received a preliminary request from the Union regarding negotiations. This letter was only a request for information. I'll be pulling together binders for distribution that will assist Select Board members through the process

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Maine Laboratories is hosting a ribbon cutting with the Mid Maine Chamber of Commerce tomorrow, April 20, at 4:00 PM at their location on Main Street.
- I met with representatives from the Mid Maine Chamber of Commerce and the new Executive Director of the Maine State Chamber of Commerce to discuss items of importance to our community and the region.
- Next week I have a meeting with DOT, the Warden Service, and the State's ATV Program regrading the Sportsmen Association's request to open State routes as trails. There are several issues that need to be worked through, but at first glance, it seems that there may only need to be a very few stretches of road opened by the State.

PUBLIC WORKS

- I am working with Haley Ward to have them administer the Federal funding for road projects. The paper workload is substantial and require an advanced level of expertise to ensure we are compliant with all HUD regulations.

SEWER

- We have been approached by our GIS mapper about having our sewer network maps
 digitized. This would be done at a discount should the Water District proceed with their
 grant-funded mapping of water lines. I am sending the request to the Sewer Commission
 before advancing it before the TIF Committee for consideration.
- Officials from USDA Rural Development came to conduct a site inspection following up on the facility upgrade project. There were no deficiencies noted during their visit.
